## SURPLUS USAFI BOOKS FOR VETERANS, LIST NO. 2

(Titles previously offered and additional titles recently acquired)

On October 23, 1946, the Library of Congress issued a first list of SURPLUS USAFI BOOKS FOR VETERANS, containing the titles of 196 publications. Additional USAFI publications, including a number of new titles, have recently become available. The present list includes these additional titles as well as all titles remaining from the first list. These books are available for distribution to educational and training institutions for issuance to veteran students only who are pursuing courses of instruction or training under Public Laws 16 and 346, 78th Congress, as amended. They may also be requisitioned by Veterans Administration supply officers as textbooks for apprenticeship training or other training on-the-job, in accordance with existing instructions.

## Description

These publications are described in the Catalog of the United States Armed Forces Institute, Third edition, 1 July 1946, as:

- 1. "Reprints of standard texts. These are ordinary text-books issued as paper bound Educational Manuals . . ."
- 2. "Self-teaching texts. These are also paper bound Educational Manuals, but in addition to ordinary textbook materials they contain study suggestions with self-examination questions (with answers) . . ."
- 3. "Correspondence courses. In some cases these consist of a number of booklets. In most cases they consist of a study guide plus one or more standard or self-teaching texts..." (These books are for resident instruction only and cannot be used as correspondence courses by an educational institution.)
- 4. A number of bound standard textbooks (reprinted for USAFI), in addition to the material described above, are also included.
